- 6. Describe the monitoring route briefly (also draw on map):

We traversed the front (W) pasture and the top (N border) of the southern back pasture using Greg Rawl's mown pathway. From the entrance to the forest trail we followed the perimeter of the forested portion of the property re-locating pins.

7. Describe any man-made alterations (draw on map/take photos. If no, write "none observed)

Alterations since 2013 monitoring: Greg Rawles has generously agreed to maintain a mown path across the front & back pastures leading to the forest trail. A forest trail has been cleared and marked within the west half of the property's forested area. Signage has been installed at the Cave Hill Rd & forest trail entrances, and along the forest trail as necessary. The property boundary has been re-established by painting blue flashes on trees at appropriate intervals along its entire perimeter where appropriate.

Noted during the monitoring walk: A short stretch of tire tracks in the mown path was probably made by Greg's mower.

8. Describe any natural alternations:

Occasional patches of horse manure in the front (W) pasture indicate persistent use by the neighbor's (N side) horses. One pile was quite fresh. We noted also manure evidence of horse on the forest trail, which was not likely left by the neighbor's because a horse is unlikely to enter the forest of its own accord.

- 10. Describe any changes in use being planned (ownership? land use?):

11. List any observations comments, areas needing discussion or review:

The issue of RGT support for liming the front (W) pasture resurfaced because there does appear to have been significant reduction in poison ivy densities compared to past years – it seems that the liming has had a very positive effect.

12. List any needed follow-up:

The forest trail should be extended in 2015 to include the eastern portion of the forested area. Stone structures should be mapped.

13. Suggestions for next year's monitoring team?

Protect against poison ivy, which persists at virulent densities in the front pasture.
