the receipt whereof which is hereby acknowledged, do hereby give grant, bargain sell and convey  
unto the said Turner A certain tract of woodland situated in said  
Leverett, bounded and described as follows (or) commencing at the  
southwest corner of said tract at a stake and stones, thence running  
Easterly on land of Parsons Brook, James Pitt and Pratt  
about one hundred and twenty six rods and eight links to a  
stake and stones in Shutesbury lines thence Northerly on Shutesbury  
line about twenty three rods and sixteen links to the bed of the  
brook; thence Westerly on the highway leading from East Leverett  
to Shutesbury about one hundred and twenty six rods to a stake  
and stones, thence Southerly on land of said Pitt about twenty  
rods and eleven links to the first mentioned corner. Containing,  
eleven acres, more or less.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the before granted premises with the privileges and  
appurtenances thereto belonging to the Rhodolphus Turner

his heirs and assigns, to his and their use and behoof forever.

And We do for ourselves our heirs, executors and administrators  
covenant with the said Turner

his heirs and assigns, that We are lawfully seized in fee of the a fore granted premises;  
That they are free of all incumbrances;

That We have good right to sell and convey the same to the said Turner.

And that We will warrant and defend the same premises to the said Turner his  
heirs and assigns forever, against the lawful claims and demands of all persons.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, We the said James Pitt, together with Mary  
Pitt his wife, hereby relinquishing all rights in said premises,  
including the right of deliver.
