## Stand 3 - Central Hardwood

## Description:

The composition of this stand is dominated by hardwoods, with some inclusions of white pine. This stand consists of approximately 10 acres and is located along the eastern boundary of the property. In this stand is the location of the abandoned road and cellar hole (old stone foundation). The road travels from the southern property boundary and continues in a northeasterly direction, the cellar hole can be found near this road and just west of the eastern property boundary. Several rock outcrops and large boulders can be found within this stand, primarily in the northwest portion.

The dominant overstory species are red oak and white pine. Regeneration is minimal and consists mostly of American beech, red maple, and some hemlock. The regeneration that is present can be described in all size classes. Other tree species present within this stand are chestnut oak and black birch. Mountain laurel is present throughout the stand, along with wintergreen, partridgeberry, and some fern species.

The health of this stand is in good condition, some trees do show damage from the ice storm of 2008, but it is not a significant amount. No invasives were identified within this stand. The slope of this stand is moderate and becomes more gradual as you approach the eastern boundary.
