The pasture across from the house (north part of the pasture) does not seem to have been either mowed or grazed during this growing season.

We came back to the car and them, given the heat, drove to the other end and walked back to the major part of the pasture which has either been moved or grazed more recently (grass shorter).

In reviewing our notes before our visit, we realized that we had never spent time locating the stone post just before the curve in the road and the iron post that marks the boundary with the church property. (Something that we try to do for all Conservation Restrictions.) Obviously June in the wrong time to look for stakes in the high grass, so we plan to come back in the fall to just locate them.

As we stood at the corner looking at this lovely area, with the new memorial garden on the other side of the road, we were thankful, once again, that this property area is protected for us - and for future generations.
