

Dear Mr. King:

Your goal for the Rattlesnake Gutter area as outlined in your June 20th letter is an admirable one indeed. I'm definitely in full accord with it. Please keep me posted on the "negotiations which are in progress at the moment".

Since the actual ravine would seem to be the nucleus of the area it would seem essential for the Commission to gain control of this area first and then perhaps a "ripple effect" westwardly from the ravine to the old Cove Hill Road. (Discontinued as a public road probably around 1835). Without having first gained control of the ravine it would seem difficult for the Commission to presuade other owners to pass control to the Commission by methods other than an outright commercial transaction.

This area is certainly a "one of it's kind" situation with an uniqueness of beauty and geological characteristics which demand conservation treatment of a high order.

I've heard rumors of such actions starting over sixty years ago when as a boy, living down at the foot of the gutter, I would see Amherst College Professors bringing classes up there on field trips.

We got our running water piped into our old farmhouse from the gutter brook with a few sections of old wooden pipe still in use when I was a youngster. Dad eventually replaced it all with lead pipe. (Before the days of lead poisoning knowledge).

I caught my first brookie at the age of six (1926) under the old stone bridge at the foot of the gutter. All of which my Mother duely recorded in my Baby Book. (That bridge was still in place last year and to the best of my knowledge never required any maintenance work). This first brookie was barely a "keeper" making the six inch minimum legal length with nothing to spare. Still as well remembered as any of the Alaskan Salmon caught since then.

Giving the right of first refusal would appear to be the logical first trys. Please tell me more.
